MONSTER WIN FOR COLTS

Pirongia Colts did enough to knock over thirdplaced Hamilton 29-26 at Pirongia on Saturday. In a tough, back-and-forth game, Pirongia managed to edge out Old Boys at the end. Pirongia started well and exerted pressure on Old Boys in the opening exchanges.

Keeping the ball in hand, they battered the Old Boys' line until the dynamic Michael Sanders crossed out wide to give Pirongia a 5-0 lead. Pirongia continued to exert pressure, but Old Boys broke into the Pirongia quarter and sustained enough pressure to score a try, leveling the score at 5-5.

Pirongia soon went back on the attack. After manipulating the defence to the right and then back to the left, Michael Sanders scored his second try to take a 10-5 lead. With midfield defence from Lochie Bolstad and Callum Hall shutting down the Old Boys' back line, Pirongia created a turnover ball from their own quarter. Using good inter-passing, they broke open the defence, and Sanders seemed to be racing away for a hat-trick, only for the pass to be called forward, leaving the score at 10-5 at halftime.

Pirongia started the second half strongly, maintaining possession. In the 9th minute, they put left wing Corbin Fleming in the clear to race



15 meters and give Pirongia a 15-5 lead. With more possession and attacks in the Old Boys' quarter, space opened on the left for Hall, who zipped through a gap only to be held up over the line. Spurred on by this piece of defense, Old Boys fed off Pirongia mistakes and exerted pressure in the Pirongia quarter, leading to two converted tries and taking a 19-15 lead with eight minutes remaining.

Then things got exciting! Some Jason Hill magic saw him take the floating kickoff from Hall on the full and glide through between four tacklers to score next to the posts, giving Pirongia a 22-19 lead. However, Pirongia failed to claim the

next kickoff, and from the scrum, Old Boys used their possession to pound the Pirongia line until they were awarded a try close to the posts, taking a 26-22 lead after the conversion.

With two minutes to go, Pirongia exerted pressure on Old Boys and created a turnover. Pirongia's backs manipulated the defence side to side, creating space for Hill to beat three defenders and cross next to the posts. Fleming's conversion gave Pirongia a 29-26 lead. With the referee now playing injury time, Pirongia secured the kickoff and wound the clock down, eventually clearing a kick from a scrum to end the game.

Pirongia's defense was strong all day, led by Captain Jay Seebeck and his fellow loosies, Sanders and Hunter Coxon. The backline defence was impenetrable, with Bolstad and Hall forming a dynamic midfield duo on both defense and attack. Under the direction of first five Kirwyn Ellis, the backline was dangerous, with fullback (and player of the day) Jason Hill and wings Corbin Fleming and Flynn Wuest gaining great yardage. Jefferey Rich made an impact off the bench with some beautiful grass-cutting tackles.

Next up is another big Hamilton club, Fraser Tech, at Pirongia.
