# A'S TAKE DOWN KEREONE

Playing their second away game of the season the mountain men turned around the two losses against Putaruru in week one to two wins v Kereone in week two.

Kereone returning to Division 1 for the first time in quite a number of seasons suffered significant losses in week one so were determined to come out strongly and take their games to the visitors this week.

Morrinsville turned on challenging weather conditions with a particularly strong wind blowing diagonally across the field.

In the main game Pirongia got off to a strong start when from a turnover in their own half a counter attack ended in a scrum 5 metres from the Kereone line. No 8 Inoke Dauniseka picked up off the back of the scrum, dummied and strode through the gap created to score the opening points.

With the wind favouring the home team, Kereone spent the next period on attack before Pirongia 2nd 5/8th Sani Ramuwai broke down the middle breaking several tackles before drawing int he last defender and linking with fullback Epa Drua Nadru who scored close to the posts allowing first-five Graham Wade to extend the lead to 12-0 with the conversion.

The next 20 minutes were spent with both teams struggling to get dominance as the game was played mostly played between the 22 meter lines. From a serious of rucks closer to the Pirongia line Kereone managed to score their first points of the season with a try to close the gap to 12-5.

Wade broke the game open when he burst through the Kereone back line early in the second half when fullback from deep in his own half, stepping a couple of defenders before crossing the line adjacent to the posts giving himself a comfortable conversion to give the visitors a 19-0 halftime lead.

Pirongia extended their lead within 2 minutes of the restart when Epa Drua Nadru scored his second try of the afternoon with Wade converting to make the score 26-5. Ten minutes later the final points of the game resulting from a Sani Ramuwai try converted by Wade again, the final score 33-5 to the visiting mountain men.

Player of the day and youngest member of the starting team Matt Henderson was outstanding in both his breakdown work and his defensive game and is destined to become a real leader in the club. ## **COLTS SNEAK DRAW VS HINUERA**

Pirongia Colts were lucky to sneak away with a 26-26 draw at Hinuera on Saturday. Pirongia had the use of a good wind in the first half but were unable to use it to their advantage as an error filed half kept Hinuera supplied with plenty of ball.

Hinueras backs look sharp from the start as they created space to surge into the Pirongia half. Under the pressure of the attack Pirongia were reduced to 14 men within the first 5 minutes as Jason Hill was sin binned for a high tackle. From the resulting pressure Hinuera were able to break a gap and score close to the posts for a 7-0 lead.



Pirongia was able to maintain some possession and string some phases together, and after some maneuvering of the defence to the right and then back to the left, the backs were able to put Corbin Fleming in for a try in the left corner. 7-5. A fumble from Pirongia from the kick off saw Hinuera gain possession and force a ty out wide to take a 12-5 lead which is how the score remained at half time.

With the wind picking up, hinuera were able to pin Pirongia in their own 22, and after sustained pressure the Pirongia defense cracked allowing Hinuera to score a try by the posts to take a 19-5 lead. It was at this point in the game that half time subs Kirwyn Eliis and Mitch Zeuren were able to exert their influence and get Pirongia out of their red zone. A mid field clearance found some land and from the resulting

bounce, Hill was able to latch on to the ball, zip through a gap and sprint away to score under the posts, the resulting conversion from replacement kicker Fleming closing the gap to 19-12.

However Hinuera used the wind and were soon back in Pirongia's 22m exerting massive pressure. The defense eventually yielding to another converted try to Hinuera to take the score to 26-12 with 10mins to play. However this spurred Pirongia into action and from the kickoff Pirongia were able to exert pressure of their own. With Hinuera desperately trying to clear down field, a charge down from Hunter Coxon saw Mitch Zeuren scoop up the loose ball to score by the posts and the resulting conversion from Fleming closing the gap to 26-19.

From the kickoff Pirongia maintained possession and worked their way down field back into Hinuera's half. From a flurry of attacks a kick was put through by Ellis which the Hinuera winger could not control. A scorching Fleming raced through to dot down 7m in from touch to close the gap to 26-24. Fleming then calmly slotted a tough conversion into the wind to lock the scores up 26-26.

With time running out on the clock Hinuera kicked deep into Pirongia territory, and were able to pin Pirongia in their 22m. With time up a clearing kick from Ellis went straight up on the 5m line, however he was able to retake the kick and set the ball for his fellow backs to clear for touch to end the game.

Number 6 Michael Sanders kept Pirongia in the game with his tackling and general play in the first half. Nathan Stewart was strong on defense in the first half and fellow prop Manaia Murphy was a bully with his tackling and running through out the game. Boston Zeuren made a strong impact from the bench as did Ellis and Mitch Zeuren. Jay Seebeck was once again Captain Courageous leading the team on attack and defense. 
