Pirongia looked good from the kickoff as they pressed the Eastern Suburbs team back into their 22m and then Mitch Zeuren charged down a kick and regather to scored beside the posts and then convert his own try for a 7-0 lead after 2 minutes. How ever form the kickoff Eastern Suburbs were able to exert their own pressure and charge down a Pirongia clearance to score their own try and close the gap to 7-5. LEAMINGTON TOO GOOD

For the first time in a number of seasons Pirongia hosted their rivals from Cambridge - Leamington. On a much more sedate Saturday afternoon after the previous weeks Ladies Day Leamington proved the much stronger opponent, particularly with their fleet footed back line who the locals struggled to keep pace with as the game went on.

With some slick handling and support play the visitors scored with the first minutes which their outstanding kicker converted from near the sideline to take a 7-0 lead. The local mountain men then matched the visitors for the next half an hour as play switched back and forwards down the field with the locals often putting together phases and then making a mistake to hand possession back to Leamington. With some evasive running and slick passing Learnington managed to score two converted tries in the last 7 minutes to take a 21-0 lead into halftime. The second stanza opened like the majority of the first spell with both teams having their moments on attack until Learnington tore the game apart between the 50th and 60th minutes scoring 4 tries with 3 converted to take an unbeatable lead 47-0.

Being the fighters they are and never giving up the home team finally managed to put right winger Daniel Belk over in the corner in the 67th Minute for their first points of the game. The mountain men then finished the game strongly putting phases together and added some slick passing to threaten the Leamington defense. Unfortunately Leamington ran in another long range try to complete the scoring 52-5.

Players to stand out for the local team was Pirongia's man of the match prop Rawiri Riddell who was ably assisted by his front row partners hooker Mathew Findsen & Tyreece Oneill. Mr Versatility Graham Wade turning out wearing the no 15 jersey this week showed his adaptability with his positional play. Improving every week, looking more comfortable in the environment is young no 7 Matt Henderson who made a number of line breaks and probably made the most meters on the day for the home team. Leamington started well and were able to break the Pirongia defence at will, rewarded with a converted try in the 3rd minute. Pirongia found it difficult to get over the advantage line with the ball in hand, and when there was a turnover, Leamington capitalised, running 40 metres to score their second try and increase their lead to 12-0.

Pirongia had a good period on attack, but due to some solid defence from the Leamington team, they could not quite finish. Leamington scored again, now holding a comfortable 17-0 lead after the conversion. As the second half came to an end, Leamington finished strongly with another try, going into the break with a well-deserved 24-0 lead. Pirongia came out firing in the second half, and with only 2 minutes on the clock, Josh Law intercepted a pass and ran 35 metres to score. Leamington hit back 10 minutes into the second half to increase their lead to 24-5. They then increased their lead to 31-5 with a converted try.

Pirongia B's had a good patch of play and were rewarded with a well-taken try by Tim Bird, who, after taking a quick tap, used his agility and strength to go over near the post. He then converted his own try to close the gap to 31-12. Pirongia were holding their own now, and play had evened out. They went close to scoring again, but it was Learnington who were able to increase the lead with a contentious try, now leading 38-12. Pirongia were not about to lie down, and it was Josh Law again who was able to break free and score, with the conversion making it 38-19. With time almost up, Learnington finished the scoring to make the final score 43-19.

Pirongia will be pleased with their second half, being much more competitive and drawing the half 19-all. Player of the day went to Josh Law, who powered his way through a ton of work and was always strong with the ball in hand.
